Glasgow boasts excellent transport links, affordable housing and living options and varied surrounding areas with something to suit all lifestyles and budgets.


Glasgow is ranked by the Mercer Cost of Living Survey as one of Europe's most

cost-effective cities and the first in the UK to be included in the Global Destination Sustainability Index. It's also been named as best UK city for millennials to live and work.

In the UK, Glasgow has the largest academic community outside London, with world leading research in life sciences, engineering, science and technology. The city has three world leading universities.

Glasgow is also home to the largest medical physics research division in the world, Europe's largest hospital (the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital) and the Beatson West of Scotland Cancer Centre (BWoSCC), the UK's most advanced NHS cancer centre.

WORKING IN GLASGOW

Owing to its position as the largest city in Scotland, and its wealth of highly skilled workers, Glasgow has been declared an economic powerhouse. Glasgow is actively attracting an eclectic mix of business, productivity and innovation, building towards being one of the most diverse and forward-thinking cities in Europe. Some of Glasgow's more globally competitive sectors include Digital Technology, Low Carbon, Health and Life Science and Creative Industries and the city is at the forefront of healthcare and innovation across the UK and Europe.

The city's workforce combines the strong Scottish work ethic with the friendliness of its residents. This had made it an attractive location and some of the biggest companies in Scotland have a base in Glasgow.

TRANSPORT

Glasgow has excellent transport links making commuting to work easy.

The city is compact with the centre built on a grid system making it easy to navigate on foot, by bike and by public transport.

Glasgow is well served by a variety of public transport options:

 Train – the city has two main railway stations. Glasgow Central Station links Glasgow by rail to the south, and Glasgow Queen Street Station operates routes mainly to Edinburgh and the north. Check out the ScotRail website for information on all routes and timetables.

LINKS TO UK CITIES AND BEYOND

Air

Glasgow Airport is Scotland's principal long-haul airport. Located approximately 9 miles west of the city centre, substantial recent investment has added new routes and improved facilities.

- One hour flying time and 324+ weekly flights to/from London
- Most European destinations are within a 2 hour flight

Rail

Central Station and Queen Street Station are the largest suburban rail networks outside of London. Regular connections to London and major English and Scottish cities makes travel throughout the UK simple.

Road

Glasgow is served by four motorway systems which efficiently link the Glasgow city region and beyond.

Bus – A number of bus operators serve

HOUSING COSTS

Glasgow has a wide range of housing options, from new developments on the waterfront to traditional tenements. Outside the city centre offers a range of family homes and a short commute.

CULTURE IN GLASGOW

Glasgow is Scotland's only UNESCO City of Music as well as home to the Royal Scottish National Opera, the National Theatre of Scotland, the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, Scottish Opera and Scottish Ballet. There are also 20 museums and galleries throughout Glasgow, most with free entry.

Throughout the year, Glasgow hosts a number of festivals and special events,

including Celtic Connections, The Glasgow Film Festival, Glasgow International Comedy Festival and Glasgow Mela. It's no surprise that Glasgow was found to be the **UK's top cultural and creative city**.

The city centre's Style Mile is a hotspot for shopping lovers and Glasgow is regularly named the best shopping in the UK outside of London.



SPORTS AND EVENTS

Glasgow is famous for its sports events and for being home to local, national and international sports teams across a vast number of sports.

The city hosted the 2014 Commonwealth Games to a resounding success and in 2018 Glasgow co-hosted the first edition of the European Championships.

In November 2021 Glasgow will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26). The COP26 summit will bring parties together to accelerate action towards the goals of the Paris Agreement and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change. The UK is committed to working with all countries and joining forces with civil society, companies and people on the frontline of climate change to inspire climate action ahead of COP26.



THRIVING LIFE SCIENCES SECTOR

Scotland is home to the second largest life sciences cluster in the UK.

The £1bn Queen Elizabeth University Hospital (QEUH) campus, developed in partnership between NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde and University of Glasgow, is the largest critical care complex in Western Europe, putting Glasgow at the forefront of healthcare innovation across the UK and Europe.

Co-located on the QEUH campus, the Queen Elizabeth Teaching and Learning Centre, a £30m purpose-built facility was developed and is managed in partnership between University of Glasgow and NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde.

A £5m state-of-the-art Glasgow Clinical Research Facility (CRF) is led by University of Glasgow and NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde for trials in adults and children.

Employing over 60 staff, the CRF works closely with NHS researchers, academic partners, contract research organisations, pharmaceutical and medical device companies.

Glasgow is home to international leaders in precision medicine, medical technology, clinical and translational medicine and pharmaceutical services.







OUTSIDE GLASGOW

While there is plenty to do in the city, Glasgow provides an excellent base to explore the rest of Scotland too. Some of the world's most beautiful scenery, like Loch Lomond and the Trossachs, can be reached in as little as an hour.

Scotland's other cities, such as Edinburgh, Dundee and Stirling can be easily reached by train, bus or car and each offer a range of things to do and see, including the newly opened V&A museum in Dundee.

Glasgow has something for all tastes and lifestyles with a thriving cultural scene and many desirable places to live.

But one of Glasgow's biggest attributes is its residents, who are some of the friendliest in the whole of the UK. The pride Glaswegians have for their city is infectious. Anyone moving there will soon be sharing this same passion for life in Glasgow.

The city's slogan '**People Make Glasgow**' emphasises what Glasgow is all about – its people. Voted one of the top 10 best cities in the world (TimeOut 'The 48 Best Cities in the World' 2019).

The diversity of the city, from its cultural life and its proximity to nature and green spaces and parks to its historical aspects means Glasgow has something to offer everyone.

ABOUT GLASGOW CITY HSCP

The way in which health and social care services are planned and delivered across Scotland has changed – and is referred to as 'Health and Social Care Integration.' Health and Social Care Integration is when Local Authorities (Councils) and Health Boards work together to jointly plan and deliver health and social care services. Integration is



about ensuring that those who use health and social care services get the right care and support whatever their needs, at the right time and in the most appropriate place.

Glasgow City Council and **NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde** (the Parent Organisations) work together to jointly deliver community health and social care services in Glasgow City. The Council and Health Board working together in this way is known as the Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership, sometimes shortened simply to 'the Partnership'.

Social work staff and relevant NHS staff are employed by their Parent Organisation but work together to deliver integrated care to support the vision of the Partnership.

Within Glasgow City, our vision for community health and social care services is to support people to flourish, work in partnership with people and organisations to transform our services for the better and engage with communities to improve health and wellbeing:

"Our medium- to long-term vision is that:

The City's people can flourish, with access to health and social care support when they need it. This will be done by transforming health and social care services for better lives. We believe that stronger communities make healthier lives."

This work is directed by the **Glasgow City Integration Joint Board**, with the Council and Health Board delivering services under the banner of the 'Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership'.

Our vision and priorities are led by our **Strategic Plan 2019-2022**. The Strategic Plan overlooks everything we do as a Partnership so it reflects the views and priorities of people living and working in the City.

The Partnership comprises of around 12,000 Social Work (Glasgow City Council) and Health (NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde) staff. It is led by an integrated Executive Leadership and Senior Management Team and it provides services through the three localities of North East, North West and South and directly provides day, home and residential care.

Applying to Work With Us

We are committed to ensuring that all applicants are treated fairly and are assessed purely on their ability to successfully perform the job. We aim to select the most suitable person for each post on the basis of their relevant skills, knowledge, qualifications and competence.

To do this we use a competency-based approach to recruitment. Using role profiles, person specifications and competency based interviews.

Role Profile:

Gives a general overview of the post along with the skills, knowledge, qualifications and competency requirements.

Person Specification:

- Gives the specific requirements of the post.
- Shows what applicants need to have (the essential criteria) and what would be good to have (the desirable criteria) in line with the competency requirements of the post.
- The selection panel will use it to short-list and show where they get evidence of the applicant's competence.





Competency Based Interview:

Applicants will be asked questions to give evidence of their competence for each competency. e.g. "Tell me about a time where you handled a difficult customer, what happened and what was the outcome"


